## EDIBLES

**APPLES:** (Bare-root 3½'-6' trees at purchase. Plant two trees for pollination.)

**0266 - Fireside-** Z3-5- Winter. Very hardy. Excellent for fresh eating, salads, sauce, baking, & drying. Firm, crisp, sweet, juicy flesh. Stores well. Highly productive, vigorous, broadly spreading tree. **\$24.50ea.**

**0497 - Macoun-** Z4-6 - Fall. Rich sweet, aromatic flavor. Juicy. Excellent for fresh eating. ME grown. **\$24.50ea.**

**1130 - Wealthy-** Z3-4 - Fall. Great for fresh eating and even better for cooking— excellent for pies. Tender, very juicy, sweet flavor. One of the most famous hardy varieties. ME grown. **\$24.50ea.**

**PEARS:** (Bare-root 3½' -6' trees at purchase. Plant two varieties for pollination.)

**1461 - Bartlett-** Z4/5 - Late Summer. Vigorous, long lived, and easy to grow. Bears young & annually. A classic. **\$24.50ea.**

**1523 - Golden Spice-** Z3 - Fall. Juicy, aromatic, and unusually spicy fruit. Good eating and canning. Extremely hardy. **\$24.50ea.**

**CHERRIES:** (Bare-root 3½' -6' trees at purchase. Self-pollinating.)

**1910 - Stella (sweet cherry)-** Z4 - Mid-summer. The first hardy, good-quality, sweet cherry. Self-pollinating. **\$24.50ea.**

**1935 - Meteor (pie cherry)-** Z3 - Summer. Good eating right off the tree, great for pies, canning, freezing, and drying. **\$24.50ea.**

**PEACHES:** (Bare-root 3½' -6' trees at purchase, no second variety needed for pollination.)

**2005 - Red Haven-** Z5 - Summer. Excellent for eating, freezing, and canning. Vigorous and highly productive. **\$24.50ea.**

**2010 - Reliance-** Z4/5 - Summer. Considered the hardiest peach, large crops - those who grow it in Maine love it! **\$24.50ea.**

**PLUMS:** (Bare-root 3½' -6' trees, self-pollinating, but 2 improves pollination. ME grown.)

**2149 - Mount Royal-** Z3 - Late Summer. Good fresh, dried, canned, frozen, or in preserves. Abundant annual crop. **\$24.50ea.**

**2180 - Stanley-** Z3 - Late Summer. Firm, juicy, sweet flesh. Excellent for cooking, eating, canning and drying. **\$24.50ea.**

☆ **LOWBUSH BLUEBERRIES:** (*Vaccinium angustifolium*, grow to 6"x24", Bare-root 2-year transplants. ME grown.)

**2260 - Z2 -** To many in Maine, the only true blueberry. Lustrous blue-green foliage in summer, bright colors in fall. Excellent for stabilizing soil on sandy banks. Supreme taste. **\$11.00ea.**

☆ **HIGHBUSH BLUEBERRIES:** (Bare-root 12"-30", 2-year-old plants, at least two varieties recommended for pollination.)

**2280 - Bluecrop-** Z4 - Mid. Consistently productive bush. Let berries ripen for a few days after they turn blue. **\$12.50ea.**

**2310 - Jersey-** Z4 - Mid-Late. Beloved old standard. Easy to grow. Productive and vigorous. ME grown. **\$12.50ea.**

**2325 - Northern-** Z3 - Dark blue berries with excellent wild flavor. Very vigorous and productive. ME grown. **\$12.50ea.**

**GRAPES:** (1-2 year old, well-rooted vines. Easy to grow and can bear plentifully, second variety not needed for pollination.)

**2370 - Beta-** Z3 - Medium-sized black berries. Excellent for juice, jelly, jam or great off the vine. Vigorous and hardy. **\$11.00ea.**

**2380 - Bluebell-** Z3 - Delicious sweet flavor. Excellent for fresh eating, jelly, and juice. Extremely hardy. **\$11.00ea.**

**RASPBERRIES:** (Well-rooted, bare-root canes. Second variety not needed for pollination.)

**2660 - Killarney-** Z3 - Early. Medium-large round fruit of excellent quality. Extremely hardy, yields consistently. **10/\$22.00**

**2685 - Nova-** Z3 - Mid. Bright red fruit with minimally spiny canes so its easy to pick. Productive and hardy. **10/\$22.00**

**BLACKBERRIES:** (Well-rooted, bare-root canes.)

**2731 - Borderland Beauty-** Z4/3 - Large thumb-sized, sweet flavored fruit. Extremely hardy. ME grown. **3/\$16.50**

**STRAWBERRY:** (50 plants will plant from 50'-100', virus-free, bare-root stock.)

**2775 - Honeoye-** Z3/4 - Tough, hardy, vigorous, extremely productive and easy to grow. Excellent freezing quality. **50/\$15.00**

**2790 - Sparkle-** Z3 - This is the perfect strawberry. Delicious fresh eating, excellent for jams or freezing. **50/\$15.00**

**HORSERADISH:** (#1 size roots. Prefers rich soil. Deep taproot with shallow runner roots. Spreads readily.)

**2860 - Bigtop-** Z3 - Exceptionally vigorous perennial with large dock-like leaves and spicy hot roots. **3/\$15.00**

**RHUBARB:** (#1 size crowns. Plant with a bushel of well-rotted manure and compost, and sidedress with manure every spring.)

**2880 - MacDonald-** Z3 - Early. Most famous for pies and wines, also great for sauce, breads and juice. **2/\$16.50**

☆ **CRANBERRY:** (Well-rooted plants. They do well in a bed or in a naturalized setting. Plant with peat moss. ME grown.)

**2892 - Stevens American-** Z3 - Famous for delicious holiday sauces, bread, and jelly. Dense evergreen ground cover, reddish purple in fall. Large deep red fruit keeps well. Productive vigorous vines. **10/\$18.50**

## CONIFERS

- 3350 - Dawn Redwood** - *Metasequoia glyptostroboides* - Z4. 100'. One of the most spectacular of all the ornamental trees. The wide irregular, iridescent golden-orange bark becomes deeply grooved, hollowed and fluted with age. Grows quickly, up to 50' in 15-20 years. Highly adaptable and easy to transplant. Deciduous with beautiful fall color. 8"-20" bare-root transplants. ME grown. **\$18.00ea.**
- 3360 - Russian Arborvitae** - *Microbiota decussata* - Z3. 1'x35'. Beautiful low-growing evergreen groundcover. Bright green, dense foliage turns bronzy purple-brown in winter. Extremely hardy. 12"-18" bare-root transplants. ME grown. **\$15.50ea.**
- 3400 - Norway Spruce** - *Picea abies* - Z2. 80'. Fast-growing, wide-spreading upright picturesque tree with graceful long pendulous branches. Orange-brown scaly bark. 9"-18" bare-root plants. ME grown. **Bundle of 5/\$15.50**
- 3420 - Colorado Blue Spruce** - *Picea pungens glauca* - Z2. Grows 30'-60'. Very popular specimen tree, truer blue than other cultivars. Good for screens. Nitrogen in spring will enhance blue color. 9"-18" bare-root plants. ME grown. **Bundle of 5/\$15.50**
- ★ **3590 - American Arborvitae** - *Thuja occidentalis* - Z2. Grows 20'-60'. Also called Eastern White Cedar. Narrow and tall with flat foliage and orange-brown bark. Great for hedges and screens. 9"-18" bare-root plants. ME grown. **Bundle of 5/\$15.50**

## SHADE TREES

- ★ **3990 - Sugar Maple** - *Acer saccharum* - Z3. Grows to 50'-100'. Also called Rock Maple, valued for shade, syrup, and lumber. Beautiful yellow, gold, scarlet, and crimson fall color. Shade tolerant. 3'-5' bare-root plants. ME grown. **\$15.50ea.**
- ★ **4009 - Black Birch** - *Betula lenta* - Z3. Grows to 60'-40'. Also called Sweet Birch, Cherry Birch. Glistening, smooth reddish-brown bark with golden yellow foliage in the fall. Sun to part shade. Attracts birds. 3'-5' bare-root plants. ME grown. **\$17.50ea.**
- ★ **4145 - White Oak** - *Quercus alba* - Z3. Grows to 70'x70'. Broad spectacular tree with finely grooved and etched bark. Edible acorns attract a variety of wildlife. Extremely long-lived. 2'-4' bare-root plants. ME grown. **\$17.50ea.**
- 4195 - Niobe Weeping Willow** - *Salix alba 'Tristis'* - Z4. Grows to 50'x50'. The classic weeping willow. Golden drooping branches that can hang down to the ground. A very large majestic graceful wide-spreading tree. Easily transplanted and fast growing. Prefers sun and moist soils. 2'-5' bare-root plants. **\$11.00ea.**
- 4207 - Littleleaf Linden** - *Tilia cordata* - Z3. Grows to 65'x40'. Wonderful all-around shade tree. Medium-fast growing tree with heart-shaped leaves. Very fragrant yellowish flowers attract bees. Easy to transplant. 24"-30" bare-root plants. **\$14.50ea.**

## ORNAMENTAL TREES

- 4245 - White Fringe Tree** - *Chionanthus virginicus* - Z3. Grows to 15'-30'x30'. Lacey white fragrant flower clusters in the spring. Beautiful dark green foliage. Bluish-black fruit attracts birds. 2'-3' transplants. ME grown. **\$18.00ea.**
- ★ **4255 - Pagoda Dogwood** - *Cornus alternifolia* - Z3. Grows to 20' x 35'. Small tree or large multi-stemmed shrub with fragrant white flower clusters in mid/late spring, Dark blue berries in midsummer. Berries eaten by birds and other wildlife. Prefers partial shade, leaves reddish-purple in the fall. 12"-30" plants. ME grown. **\$13.50ea.**

**FLOWERING CRABAPPLES:** (3½' - 6' bare-root trees at purchase. Will pollinate other apples. ME grown.)

- 4754 - Red Jade**, Z4 - Grows to 15'x20'. Glossy, vibrant green foliage with pink buds, white flowers. Popular w/ birds. **\$24.50ea.**
- 4780 - Sargent**, Z4 - Grows to 8'x15'. Curving branches, pink buds, profuse white fragrant flowers. Loved by birds. **\$24.50ea.**

## ORNAMENTAL SHRUBS

- ★ **2938 - Serviceberry/Shadbush** - *Amelanchier canadensis* - Z3. Grows 6'-20'. A short, multi-stem shrub, that has pretty white spring flowers followed by purple-black sweet, juicy berries. Nice fall color. 18"-24" bare-root plants. ME grown. **\$15.50ea.**
- ★ **4332 - Witch Hazel** - *Hamamelis virginiana* - Z3. Grows to 20'-30'. A large shrub with interesting crooked branches and fragrant fall yellow flowers. Foliage opens red, turns green, then yellow in fall. 9"-30" bare-root transplants. ME grown. **\$14.50ea.**
- ★ **4961 - Red Chokeberry** - *Aronia arbutifolia* - Z4. Grows 10'x5'. Showy white flowers with red stamens. Dark green foliage turns a spectacular crimson in the fall. Birds love the berries. Spreads by suckers. Wet or dry soils, sun or partial shade. Considered the best native alternative to the invasive burning bush. 12"-30" bare-root transplants. ME grown. **\$10.00ea.**
- ★ **5069 - Clethra 'Ruby Spice'** - *Clethra alnifolia* - Z3. 4'-5' x same. AKA Summersweet. Red buds and beautiful spires of heavenly scented deep pink flowers in summer. Butterflies love it! Easy to grow. 10"-24" bare-rooted plants. ME grown. **\$12.50ea.**
- 5127 - Redvein Enkianthus** - *Enkianthus campanulatus* - Z4. 10'x5'. Delicate bell-shaped yellow/orange flowers veined with red in the spring. Green foliage turns brilliant yellow to orange in the fall. 12"-18" bare-root transplants. ME grown. **\$13.50ea.**
- 5142 - 'Northern Gold' Forsythia** - *Forsythia ovata* - Z3. 7'x6'. Beautiful golden-yellow flowers. Outstanding bud hardiness— even above snowline! One of the first flowers in the spring. 9"-18" bare-root transplants. ME grown. **\$13.50ea.**
- ★ **5215 - Spicebush** - *Lindera benzoin* - Z4. Grows 6'-12'x8'-12'. Soft-yellow spring flowers followed by clusters of glossy red berries. Attracts bees, birds, and butterflies. Delicious lemon-spicy scent. 9"-12" bare-root transplants. ME grown. **\$13.50ea.**

- 5222 - Dropmore Honeysuckle**— *Lonicera x brownii* - Z3. Grows 10'-20'. Climbing honeysuckle with scarlet-orange tubular flowers that attract hummingbirds and butterflies. Easy to grow. This is not the invasive honeysuckle. 2-yr transplants. **\$11.00ea.**
- ☆ **5240 - Bayberry** - *Myrica pensylvanica* - Z2/3. Grows to 5'-9'. Rounded deciduous semi-evergreen shrub with very aromatic foliage. Great for shoreland plantings and wildlife. Salt tolerant. Full sun to partial shade. 12"-24" transplants. **\$13.50ea.**
- 5267 - Blizzard Mockorange** - *Philadelphus lewisii* - Z3. Grows 4'-5'x3'. Gorgeous fragrant pure-white flowers with deep-dark-blue-green foliage. Full sun to partial shade. Flowers right after lilacs. 18"-32" robust, multi-branched bare-root plants. **\$13.50ea.**
- 5288 - 'Abbotswood' Potentilla**- *Potentilla fruticosa*- Z2. Grows 2'-3' x same. Prolific, pure white single flowers with yellow stamens. One of the first potentillas to start blooming. 18"-24" bare-root transplants. ME grown. **\$11.00ea.**
- ☆ **5720 - White Snowberry** - *Symphoricarpos albus*. Z3. 5'-6' by same. Also called Waxberry or Common Snowberry. Broad, arching and spreading, long-stemmed wildlife shrub. Excellent for holding soil on a shady, moist bank. Great for wildlife cover and forage. 12"-18" bare-root transplants. ME grown. **\$11.00ea.**
- 5918 - Korean Spicebush** - *Viburnum carlesii*. Z4. 4'-8' by same. Also called Koreanspice Viburnum. One of the first shrubs to flower in the spring. Showy cherry-pink buds open to white wonderfully fragrant flowers that turn into reddish-black fruits. Dark bluish-green foliage turns reddish purple in the fall. Attracts butterflies and birds. 9"-15" bare-root transplants. **\$14.50ea.**
- ☆ **5921 - Witherod Viburnum**— *Viburnum cassinoides* - Z3. 5'-6' x same. Also called Northern Wild Raisin. Creamy-white flowers with yellow stamens turn into the highly desired multicolored fruit which turns from green to pink to red to blue to black. Foliage emerges bronze tinted and turns red and purple in the fall. 9"-12" bare-rooted transplants. **\$14.50ea.**
- 5958 - 'Courtalor' Carnival Weigela** - *Weigela florida* - Z4. 4'-5'x3'-5'. Compact, dense shrub with amazing multicolored red-pink-white tubular flowers. Attracts tons of hummingbirds. Will do the best in full sun. 12"-18" bare-root transplants. **\$14.50ea.**
- ☆ **WINTERBERRY:** (*Ilex verticillata* - Z4. Deciduous holly with clusters of upright stems. Richly foliated. Best known for its profusion of bright red berries which stand out after the leaves have fallen and keep their color all winter. Both male and female plants needed for berry production. ME grown.
- 5197 - 'Winter Red'**- Female plant. Winner of the 1998 Cary Award for Distinctive Plants for New England. Hardy. 'Southern Gentleman' required for pollination. 12"-16" bare-root transplants. **\$12.00ea.**
- 5201 - 'Southern Gentleman'**- Male plant. One will pollinate several 'Winter Reds'. 9"-16" bare-root transplants. **\$12.00ea.**
- ROSE** (*Rosa* - Hardy, vigorous, easy to grow, and disease, and pest resistant.)
- 5350 - 'Rugosa'** - Z2. 4'-6' by same. Also called the Beach Rose. Vigorous shrub with flowers ranging from deep pink to white. Red hips are great for making jams and teas and can even be eaten fresh. Tolerates salt, pollution, and drought. Easy to grow and practically care-free. 1'-3' bare-root plants. ME grown. **Bundle of 3/\$18.50**
- 5384 - 'Carefree Sunshine'** - Z4. 3'-4' by same. Lemon yellow to bright yellow, lightly fragrant, semi-double flowers in late spring/early summer repeating until frost. Dark green foliage. Compact rounded form. Very disease resistant. **\$12.00ea.**
- LILAC** (*Syringa* - Z3. Excellent alone or in hedges. Deep green, glossy heart-shaped foliage looks good from spring through fall, intensely fragrant blooms in May over a period of weeks. Large 2-3 year old bare-root transplants. ME grown.)
- 5777 - 'Miss Kim'** - *S. patula* - 8' x 8'. Heavily scented extremely prolific lavender blooms. Red-purple buds. Small dark green foliage turns dark maroon in the fall. Very compact rounded form. One of the most popular "uncommon" lilacs. **\$14.50ea.**
- 5817 - 'Avalanche'** - *S. vulgaris* spp. - 8'-10' by same. Very showy, heavily fragrant, single pure white blooms. Dark green foliage. Vigorous. Excellent for shrub borders. **\$14.50ea.**

## TENDER SUMMER BULBS

(Lift and store them over the winter or treat them as annuals)

- 6031 - Pink Camellia Tuberous Begonia** - 12" tall. Intense velvety flowers with red-tinted foliage. Big 2+" tubers. **2/\$7.00**
- 6052 - Crocosmia 'Lucifer'** - 24"-36" tall. Bright red flowers that glow in the garden. Excellent for pots or as cutflowers. **15/\$10.50**
- 6182 - Large Flowering Gladiolus Mix** - 36" tall. Showy summer bloomer that makes an excellent cutflower. **20/\$6.00**

## HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS

(These come as dry packed plants, unless otherwise noted)

- ☆ **6282 - Butterfly Weed** - *Asclepias tuberosa* - Z4. 24" tall. Bright tangerine flowers attract zillions of butterflies. **3/\$12.50**
- ☆ **6292 - Aster 'Alma Potschke'** - *Aster novae-angliae* - Z4. 30"-36" tall. A wonderful late summer/fall flower. Attracts lots of butterflies and beneficial insects. Makes a nice cutflower. This variety has intense flowers of salmon-rose. **3/\$12.50**
- 6352 - Lily of the Valley** - *Convallaria majalis* (white) - Z2. A hardy, easy to grow plant. Produces fragrant white, bell-shaped flowers that bloom in late spring/early summer followed by small orange berries. Prefers partial/full shade. 6"-8" tall. **10/\$8.50**
- 6363 - Delphinium 'Magic Fountains' Mix** - Z3. Grows 28"-36" tall. Mix includes white, pink, lavender, lilac, sky blue, and dark blue. Long-lived and no staking required. Perfect for smaller gardens. Full sun or part shade. 3" plugs. **6/\$19.50**
- 6382 - 'Luxuriant' Western Bleeding Heart** - *Dicentra formosa* - Z3. 12"-15" tall. Cherry red flowers that bloom all summer long. Lush, finely cut light green foliage that can handle heat and drought. Excellent border plant. Likes partial shade. **3/\$13.00**

**6422 - 'Carillon' Foxglove** - *Digitalis grandiflora* - Z3. 12"-15" tall. True perennial foxglove. Low-growing plant bears creamy-yellow flowers with brown flecks inside. Flowers June-August. Great for cutting or borders. Full sun to partial shade. **3/\$12.50**

**6502 - 'Brookside' Geranium** - *Geranium pretense x clarkei* - Z4. 20"-24" tall. Vigorous, lush, and very long blooming. Purple flowers with creamy white centers. Forms a compact mound. Foliage turns vivid shades of red-orange in the fall. **3/\$13.00**

**6652 - 'Harpwell Snowburst' Iris** - *Iris sibirica* - Z3. 36" tall. Violet-blue with a striking white splotch. The petals are edged with a delicate white rim. Excellent for cutting. Full sun or partial shade. ME grown. **3/\$15.50**

**6672 - Lavender 'Munstead'** - *Lavandula angustifolia* - Z4. 15"-18" tall. Aromatic grey-green foliage with spires of lavender-blue flowers all summer. Valued for dried arrangements and potpourri. Excellent for borders and slopes. ME grown. **2/\$12.50**

**6772 - Bee Balm 'Jacob Cline'** - *Monarda didyma* - Z3. 3'-5' tall. Very large 5" red flowers. Loved by bees, butterflies and hummingbirds. Blooms in July and August. Aromatic foliage. Great for borders, wet areas, and cutting. **3/\$12.50**

★ **6932 - Solomon's Seal** - *Polygonatum biflorum* - Z3. Forms clumps of graceful arching stems about 3' long. Greenish-white bell-shaped flowers dangle from stems in late spring and become blue-black fruits in early fall. Loves shade. **3/\$11.00**

**7022 - Cimicifuga** - *Cimicifuga racemosa* - Z3. Grows 9'-14' tall. Also called Black Cohosh, Black Snakeroot. Flourishes in the wilder part of the garden or shady border. Spikes of creamy-yellow flowers in late summer. Easy to grow and long lived. **2/\$12.00**

**7032 - Purple Coneflower** - *Echinacea purpurea* - Z3. Grows 30"-48" tall. Lavender-purple petals surround coppery-yellow brown centers. Flowers attract butterflies and make great cut flowers. This is the classic coneflower. ME organically grown. **2/\$13.50**

**ASTILBE:** (Z4. Also called Feather Flower and False Spirea. Easy to grow, hardy, and long-lived.)

**6322 - 'Visions'** - *A. chinensis* - 14"-16" tall. Raspberry-red plumes are sweetly fragrant. Large true-green foliage forms nice clumps. Drought-tolerant, does not require moist soils. **3/\$9.00**

**6342 - 'Ostrich Plume'** - *A. thunbergii* - 30"-40" tall. Large coral pink flowers with a gorgeous arching habit. **3/\$8.50**

**FERNS:** (Wonderful as foundation plantings, low-maintenance foliage plants, and excellent additions to any shade garden.)

★ **6432 - Christmas Fern** - *Polystichum acrostichoides* - Z3. Grows 18"-24" tall. Leathery dark green leaves are partially evergreen. Provides good fall interest and emerges in very early spring to complement woodland flowers. Light shade. **3/\$11.00**

★ **6452 - Lady Fern** - *Athyrium filix-femina* - Z3. Grows 1'-2' tall. Graceful bright green lacy fronds. Great as a foundation planting on the shady side of a house. Spreads easily from spores in moist soil. Tolerates some sun. **3/\$11.00**

★ **6462 - Maidenhair Fern** - *Adiantum pedatum* - Z2. Grows 10"-12" tall. Delicate tiny ginkgo-like green leaves on glossy black stems. Likes semi-shade or shade and moist soils. Very hardy. **3/\$11.00**

★ **6482 - Royal Fern** - *Osmunda regalis* - Z3. Grows 3' tall by 6' wide. Huge showy garden fern. Soft and wavy lance-shaped light green fronds can reach 3' in length. One of the oldest plant genera native to N. & S. America and Asia. **3/\$13.00**

**DAYLILIES:** (*Hemerocallis* - Z2. The champion low-maintenance perennial, produces a bush of narrow arched leaves topped with lily-shaped flowers from July to September. Very hardy, flourishes under a wide range of conditions - full sun to part shade.)

**6532 - 'Ed Murray'** - 40"-48" tall. Intense purple-maroon flowers with slightly ruffled edges. Bright yellow-green throats. **3/\$10.00**

**6552 - 'Mauna Loa'** - 40"-48" tall. Bright orange centers progress to tawny orange petals. Creates a fascinating glow. **3/\$10.00**

**HOSTA:** (Valuable and cherished low-maintenance border plant and shade-loving ground cover spring to frost. Z3.)

**6612 - 'August Moon'** - Large golden yellow leaves. Does well in sun or shade. White flowers touched with lavender. **3/\$9.00**

**6632 - 'Halcyon'** - Frosty blue-green pointed leaves with pale blue-violet flowers. Resist slugs. Makes great clumps. **3/\$12.00**

**LILIES:** (*Lilium* - Z3. Queen of the perennial border, fabulously showy and easy to grow. Plant bulbs 6-8" deep and 6" apart in rich, well-drained soil. Prefers light shade. Asiatics bloom early and are smaller. Orientals bloom later and are much taller.)

**6702 - 'Cancun'** - Asiatic. 44"-48" tall. Golden-yellow with orangey-bronze petal tips. Warm and striking. **6/\$11.00**

**6712 - 'Monte Negro'** - Asiatic. 42" tall. Intense deep chocolate red petals. One of the earliest lilies to bloom. **6/\$10.50**

**6742 - 'Stargazer'** - Oriental. 24"-30" tall. Deep rose with darker spots and a white edge. Fragrant flowers. **6/\$10.50**

**GARDEN PEONY:** (*Paeonia lactiflora* - Z3. Huge double flowers are stunning on the bush and wonderful when cut, blooming late spring to early summer. Red shoots appear in spring and form a bushy clump of lustrous, dark green, deeply lobed foliage.)

**6801 - 'Buckeye Belle'** - 30" tall. Deep red, nearly maroon, broad outer petals form a cup around smaller inner petals sprinkled with golden stamens. Strong stems - excellent cutflower. **\$15.50ea.**

**6821 - 'Primavera'** - 28" tall. Light yellow serrated inner petals surrounded by creamy-white petals that fan out to a diameter of up to 5 inches. Exceedingly fragrant. **\$14.00ea.**

**GARDEN PHLOX** (*Phlox paniculata* - Z3. Produces large spreading clusters of fragrant flowers in mid-late summer. Attracts butterflies and hummingbirds. Prefers humus-rich soil that stays cool and moist. Full sun to part shade.)

**6892 - 'David'** - 30"-42" tall. White flowers create enormous fragrant blooms. 2002 PPA Plant of the Year. **3/\$12.00**

**6902 - 'Laura'** - 24"-30" tall. Bright fuchsia-purple flowers with a white star center. Abundant fragrant blooms. **3/\$12.00**

**6912 - 'Starfire'** - 25"-36" tall. Large abundant cherry-red flower clusters. Fragrant and reliable. **3/\$9.00**
